

Father/Son Team Finds Sierra Gold

Nestled high in the Eastern Sierra above French Canyon, a trio of backcountry lakes are noted for growing some of the largest golden trout in California.

and Puppet lakes, located in the John Muir Wilderness between Fresno and Bishop, have produced a dozen line or tippet class world records for outdoor writer (and California Angler contributor) Don Vachini and his 19 year-old son, Jason. Using meticulous stalking approaches with tiny nymphs and yellowhued spinners, this father/son team has managed to unlock the mysteries of these vast, deep and completely rockbound waters near 12,000 feet.

Most recent standards were established on an August 21-22, 1990 trek to Puppet Lake, when Don bettered his own 10-pound line class record with a 1-pound, 13-ounce Salmo aqua-bonita. Jason set the new 8-pound tippet class with a 1-pound, 14-ounce lunker. Joining this duo was Andy Gough, who claimed the 4-pound tippet class with a 1-pound, 14-ounce golden. All records are with the National Freshwater Fishing Hall of Fame.

With several unverified catches up to 5 pounds and frequent reports of leviathans in the 6-8 pound range, Darrell Wong, of the

DFG office in Bishop, predicts even better results in the future. He even feels the next state record could be finning in these forlorn waters.
